Streetlight repair on Caracol

In the previous newsletters we have seen how the Association has been an important contributor to maintaining the infrastructure of the the Caracol. From the roads, clean up, water supply and hill plumbing, it has been the objective of the association to make not only repairs, but make many improvements. In many cases, the city works departments are willing to help, but lack the funds to repair and replace equipment. Near the end of 2013 nearly 50% of the Caracol street lights were not functional. Public Works was unable to attend to the repairs for lack of resources. Jim and Nidza Busse, with funds from the Caracol Association, took the lead. The Comisario was contacted to solicit his help. The Comisario negotiated the cost for replacing the three main components of the lighting system: the bulb, the photocell and the ballast. He solicited the support of the Public Works department in Guaymas to schedule the necessary work and lift trucks.

Three major components for 30 lights were purchased. Electrical connections to many poles were improved.

New hardware such as lamp arms and lenses were also installed. Thanks to David Delgado from Public Works for suppling the workers and Dick Lanning for helping to check the operation of the poles.

Months of effort by the Caracol Association and many residents have improved the security and safety of the hill at night. Thank you for paying your dues and volunteering where you can. You benefit yourself and other residents on the hill.
