Last month I talked about the Association's effort to get the streetlights repaired. Well the workers from Guaymas finally showed up, and directed by Nidza and Jim Busse, most of the streetlights have been repaired. The small map in the upper right of the newsletter shows the current status of the streetlights on the Caracol. Also a few red (red is bad) dots. Some red dots persist in spite of rebuilding the lights.

Monetary pressures increase this time of year, and the potential for burglary is higher than normal. The guards do a good job controlling access to the hill. An observation: Your newsletter editor checks on the new entrance several times daily. With the automated exit and guards monitoring the entrance, we have essentially eliminated problems at the entrance. Before the new entrance, maintenance was costly both in time and money to keep everything working. We now enjoy a relatively hassle free entry/exit and enhanced security on the hill.
