Well, here it is, August already! August is normally a quite time on the hill, and this is no exception. Next month we will see the return of a small portion of missing residents, until then, there are a few items to report.

Plants, including weeds, are greening up nicely in San Carlos, even though we have had little rain yet this summer. The annual crop of weeds that awaits the nourishing rains are beginning their push to the surface of the roads. Last year we purchased a sprayer for the application of herbicides. Several volunteers for the association have begun spraying the roads to keep down the weeds.

I wanted to report to all on the status of Abulon (upper road). The installation of Adoquin has now been finished. Two lanes of pavers are in place from the intersection of Cabrillas and Abulon to the north end circling the upper pila. Many thanks to all of the residents that contributed funds and volunteers that donated their time to make this significant upgrade to the road. Job well done! We have noticed that on roads that have Adoquin, there has been a reduction in the number of leaks. This is just one type of “thumb in the dike” that we need to address considering the reduced water supply. Fund raising for Langosta is continuing and we hope that sufficient funds will have been collected to begin the paving in the coming year. Summer is the time when the hill is mostly empty and for those residents remaining on the hill it is a time for heightened vigilance.
